

I. Read the Extract A and Extract B and then answer the questions from 1 to 8:

Extract A: From *The Road to the Sky* by Eliza Reed

Extract B: **The Power of Dreams and Ambitions**

1. What is the main theme of both texts?

9. What does the speaker mean by "I walk through life with my eyes closed tight"?
